Chaperon-BC Presidents Meeting

BC presidents' meeting with the chaperons was the first official program for the BC presidents in the Marine House. The meeting was attended by APCC coordinators, board of directors, BCIO

management team, BC presidents and chaperons from the different delegate countries. The meeting created a platform for the chaperons and BC presidents to better understand each other's roles and experiences in preparing and training JAs for the BRIDGE Summer Camp and also have a better understanding of the Asian Pacific Childrens' Convention, BRIDGE CLUB International Organization and BRIDGE CLUB Professional Network.



The meeting commenced with a welcome speech by the APCC senior executive director, Mr. Masaomi Fuji followed by screening of the APCC PR video. A presentation was then given about the APCC and its programs which include BRIDGE Summer Camp, BRIDGE Challenge Trip, APCC for education, and the Smile Support Project. This presentation was followed by a presentation by Ms. Betsy Wo, president of BC Hawaii about sending a delegation to the BRIDGE Summer Camp. Chaperon from Singapore also shared about how the BRIDGE Challenge Trip was organized and coordinated in Singapore for the delegates from Japan. There was also a presentation by the BC President and Chaperon from Papua New Guinea about the process and their experience of being a part of the Online Exchange Program.

BCIO management team members also shared about the BCIO, its history and the BCPN along with its vision, mission and objectives. Programs within the BCPN were also shared in the meeting encouraging and welcoming involvement from all the former APCC participants including the Liaison Offices and the chaperons. The new BCIO management team and the new BC presidents announced were then and inaugurated officially. ΑII the inaugurated BCIO management team members the and



presidents took an oath to fulfill the BCIO promise throughout their tenure. After the oath, BCIO General Manager, Ms. Tsu Yamin gave her inaugural speech. Finally, the program was concluded by the closing remarks from Mr. Masayuki Yamashita, Operating Director of the APCC. This meeting played an important role in instilling more collaboration between all the entities associated with the APCC and BCIO.

BRIDGE Treasure Hunt

BC Presidents were asked to bring small coins from their countries, and they were hidden around the Global Arena by the APCC coordinators and BCIO management team. It was the first team activity, which allowed the young BC Presidents to explore the Global Arena and have a bonding time while completing the assigned tasks in each designated area. The Presidents were asked to sing 'We are the BRIDGE' song, do a popular Tik-Tok dance, untangled themselves in Human-Knot activity and find the hidden coins. All collected coins were made into artworks and the best artwork was awarded by APCC Vice Operating Director, Hisae san. BRIDGE Treasure Hunt will always be remembered as a special memory for all the Presidents.









Exchange program with Munakata city

BC Presidents were taken to the English Cafe in Munakata City for an interaction program with the Japanese citizens from Munakata. The participants from Munakata were the local residents who were a part of an English speaking club which they had joined after their retirement.

The program was organized in a speed dating setup such that each BC President could interact with a different Munakata citizen every 5 minutes. It was a very interesting learning experience for the BC Presidents as they were able to talk about the life experiences with people who have worked most part of their lives in different industries ranging from aviation, engineering, medicine and education. While some interactions were about having conversations about life, work and other topics, other interactions were also about learning origami from the Munakata citizens, and sharing about Japanese traditions as well. This made the entire program very vibrant, light and interesting.

After the interactions were over, the participants shared that the whole experience was delightful and that they were able to learn a lot about each other.





BCIO: The Past, Present and Future

BC Presidents were given a presentation on the history of APCC and BCIO for the past 35 years. A great number of common activities, common themes, online meetings and BRIDGE projects were organized since BCIO was established in 2008. They were reminded how little things have become big things in life. The reason BCIO has achieved so much is because of a strong foundation the past Head Office Members have created and new leaders supporting the organization with new and fresh



ideas. APCC has nurtured so many leaders with OMOIYARIi spirit in their hearts that 11-year-old young children have turned into strong leaders of their countries. In order to ensure APCC-BCIO's bright future, BC Presidents were given a task to have a discussion and present their ideas on the BRIDGE Vision Board for 3-5 years. The young leaders came up with brilliant ideas and projects for the future. Virtual Friendship Circles, an online meet-up program between former Junior Ambassadors, Peace Ambassadors, Chaperones, Liaison Officers, Volunteers and APCC host families will be organized by the BC Presidents throughout the year. This will bring a deeper friendship bond and mutual understanding between the APCC family members. This session was concluded by asking the BC Presidents to write down their best experience as a goodwill ambassador with the theme 'APCC Saikou/APCC, the BEST'.

Stronger BCs I: Better Together

BC Presidents' were asked to perform a SWOT analysis of their BCs for them to understand their BCs better. The session began by sharing the overall observations of the SWOT analysis submitted by the presidents. One common sentiment found in the majority of BCs was that our members are our biggest strengths. And, even though the challenges faced by the BCs varied depending on each BC's context, there were some common challenges that we could overcome together.




The session then directed towards identifying and

finding the possible solutions for the common challenges that the BCs are facing. While the discussion was focused on solving the challenges faced by the BCs, it was also reiterated throughout the session that some challenges may not always be solvable and we would have to learn to find a work around for it. In case of such challenges it would be important to think of ways to leverage our strengths such that they overpower the challenges we have.

The presidents then worked in groups to come up with the 5th BCPM promises to strengthen our BCs.





BRIDGE CLUB: The power of connection (Physical and Mental well-being)

Being in a leadership position can get stressful and overwhelming at times. A leader always performs best to their ability when they are in the best of their mental and physical health. To

emphasize this message for the BC Presidents, this session was organized with focus on connecting with the inner self, and mental and physical fitness.

In the first half of the session, Garima led a zumba session which is a very fun way to stay fit and active. Even though the activity made everyone out of breath, the BC Presidents enjoyed the activity and participated in it with full enthusiasm.



Being leaders of the BRIDGE CLUBs, the management team believes that the presidents should have a strong mentality and special connection with the BC members. Meditation has been

proved as an effective way to start the day in many countries. It brings positive energy, stability and the ability to make better decisions according to the research done in the past decade. A short introduction to meditation was introduced by Yamin as she has been practicing meditation for many years. The BC Presidents learned the basic methods of meditation and some could complete the session very well that it will bring positive impacts in their lives and leading the BCs as well.



Fashion show rehearsal

During their time in Global Arena, the BC Presidents had one hour designated each day to prepare for their performance for the 'We are the BRIDGE Festival 2023'. They had a performance including a fashion show of their national/traditional dress followed by a quick dance performance. After a full day of sessions and activities, the presidents still gathered up their energy for the practice and rehearsals at the end of the day.



This rehearsal also reflected the presidents' teamwork, taking initiatives and pitching in ideas to create a beautiful performance. During the rehearsals, the presidents unleashed their creative sides and generated ideas on how the performance could be better. Special mention to Nishant who choreographed the whole performance and Mariana who contributed to the dance portion of the performance.

The rehearsal time was also an opportunity for everyone to hang out together in a more casual environment and get to know each other better. On 20th July, after the end of rehearsals, the presidents celebrated Saman's (President, BC Pakistan) birthday together. The birthday celebration turned out to be another occasion for the BC Presidents to form deeper bonds with each other.



Stronger BCs II: Leverage & Embrace Virtual Globe

Stronger BCs II was a session about improving inter BRIDGE CLUB collaboration and cooperation in order to strengthen our BCs individually and as a whole. The session started with a quick activity for the BC presidents to recall their favorite inter BC activities that have been done. Then, Garima shared how the BCs have collaborated to organize different inter BC activities in the past with examples. Presidents from BC India and Sri Lanka also shared about their experience and the overall process of their most recent inter BC activity 'Food Fiesta'. Garima concluded the first half of the session by



stressing on the fact that the BCs have come up with many creative ideas to collaborate with each other and how we can learn from these ideas and from each other to strengthen our BRIDGE CLUBs through inter-BC activities.

In the second half of the session, Moiz led an interactive discussion to talk about the tools and technology available currently that we can leverage into realizing our ideas for the inter-BC collaboration. He discussed different tools like Zoom, Google Meet, Notion, etc. some of which the BC Presidents were familiar with and some of which they were new to. It was an interactive session where the BC presidents also shared the tools that they have been using to enhance efficiency and collaboration in their work. Finally, the discussion also came up with a list of inter-BC activities that can be carried out in order to enhance the collaboration between the BRIDGE CLUBs and in turn strengthening them.

Website, Design & SMM Workshop

This workshop was conducted in order to equip the BC presidents to better manage their social media platforms and the BCIO website. The workshop started with quick refreshers on updating BC activity reports on the BCIO website facilitated by Garima. Then, Mizuki, the president of BC Japan delivered a session on the basics of Canva and creating designs using the platform.

The final part of the workshop was facilitated by Moiz, who shared ideas on managing the BCs' social media handles. The session also included how social media and branding of the organization can be used in getting sponsorships for the organization.



BCPN, discussion ideas on the future. Next BCPN

The session on BCPN led by Moiz, gave the BC Presidents a brief overview of BCPN's mission, vision and the current ongoing projects of the BCPN. The session also involved discussions about what the Next BCPN should look like in the coming years. We also unveiled the BCPN Pamphlet which was the hard work of our talented BCPN Interns 2023. That will be used as a first source of information in future conferences.

As a part of the session, the BC Presidents were divided into three groups where they planned a BCPN Stars project that they would carry out together. All three groups came up with many fresh ideas for projects for the BCPN. One idea from each group was then chosen by the BCIO Management Team to carry forward. Then, as a final group discussion for the BCPN, the presidents worked together to create a project plan for the project that was chosen from their group. After the group discussion they pitched their project idea and execution plan in detail. It was commendable what each group was able to come up with in a short period of time.

The three groups as divided in the session will work together to implement their BCPN project post the 5th BC Presidents' Meeting. The projects that will be implemented are as follows:

- 1. Mentor Mentee Arrangement
- 2. BCPN Career Summit Expo
- 3. Online Study Groups
