








## Message from the BCIO General Manager



### **BCIO PAST & PRESENT**

BRIDGE CLUB International Organization (BCIO) celebrates its 15th Anniversary in 2023. Starting from this year, it was decided to have two Peace Ambassador Programs, one virtually and another in Fukuoka during the BRIDGE Summer Camp. This enables the newly selected Peace Ambassadors to work together and learn ways to strengthen their BRIDGE CLUBs as new leaders before coming to Japan. Moreover, Peace Ambassadors were given opportunities to express their ideas during different sessions at Virtual PA camp. As a result, BCIO achieved a clearer vision on how to nurture the new PAs and evaluate each BC before the PA camp in Fukuoka. Only PAs from active BCs will be invited to Fukuoka, so this new style of management motivates the Peace Ambassadors to lead their BCs and complete the PA tasks throughout the year.

During this session, Peace Ambassadors were given a presentation on a brief history of BCIO and encouraged to complete the Common Activity 2022-2023 **'Sustainability in 60 seconds'** by Yamin. The new BCIO organization structure was presented by the BCIO management team and the new BCIO Head Office members were introduced to the group. The Peace Ambassadors were also asked to introduce themselves, and each of them shared what they would like to achieve while leading their BRIDGE CLUBs.

After an amazing introduction into the event, it was time for the **BC Bubbles**! I first held an **icebreaker** game! BCs decide on an activity that all will accomplish each year. These Common Activities take the form of donation drives, educational programs, environmental actions, cultural campaigns, and many more. Before proceeding with brainstorming for the 2024 Common Activity, the Peace Ambassadors were made acquainted with Common Activities over the years.

By BC Bubble breakout rooms, PAs then began **brainstorming** for ideas answering the following guide questions: What is the activity?; Why should we do this CA?; What are your objectives?; Is this activity year-round or for a certain time only? What's your timeline?; Will the CA be held virtually/or physically?; Who can participate in the CA?; How will the CA be implemented?

Brainstorming continued until each BC Bubble chose one final idea to present to the rest of the group. These ideas included memory capsules, inter-BC snack exchange, cookbook, cleaning program, and inspirational women's campaign. Upon voting, the **PAs decided on a food-related CA this year** that will have something common to all countries while also allowing each BC's identities and cultures to customize the activity.


